Dear Harbor View family,

This Sunday we celebrate World Communion, which reminds us that we have a family of faith over the entire world. Christians in every country will be meeting together, sharing communion, and remembering Jesus's life and ministry. No matter where we are, we are one in Christ! As you take communion this Sunday, you'll be given a flag representing another country. I invite you to pray for the Christians and the people of faith in that country, where they may not have the freedoms that we do to worship openly and without danger. While we are so grateful for these rights we enjoy, it's good to remember that others may not have what we take for granted, and to pray for them.

I will be with you for two more Sundays, and then I will be completing my contract and will be moving on to launch my new church in Park Circle, Church of the Arts. Many of you have asked how you can be supportive of this new church development, and I want to give you four possible ways:

1. Pray. Ask God to help us reach people who have gotten lost from church or from God or both.
2. Give. If you want to make a donation to this ministry, please ask me for the link or send a check to Charleston Atlantic Presbytery - Church of the Arts, 4701 Park Place West, N Charleston, SC 29405. Be sure to indicate it is for Church of the Arts in the memo.
3. Consider visiting COA for the opening service on November 23. I can only take up to ten people from HV on that day, so please let me know if you intend to come so I can keep track. (Since the service is at 11am, you'd have to miss the church service here, and that's partly why I'm limiting numbers.)
4. There may be someone at Harbor View who feels strongly led by God to help me launch this church and get it going. If that is you, please meet with me to discuss it. I do need a limited number of regular churchgoers from various churches to commit to being "missionaries" with me for a one year period. Session has given their blessing if anyone wants to make this one year commitment.

I look forward to seeing what God will do here at Harbor View as well as at Church of the Arts in the coming year. We have so much to look forward to!

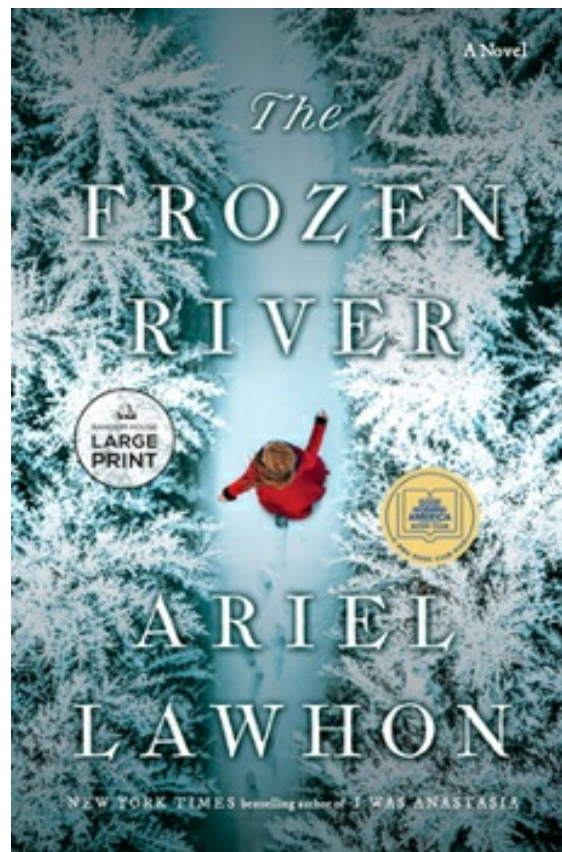

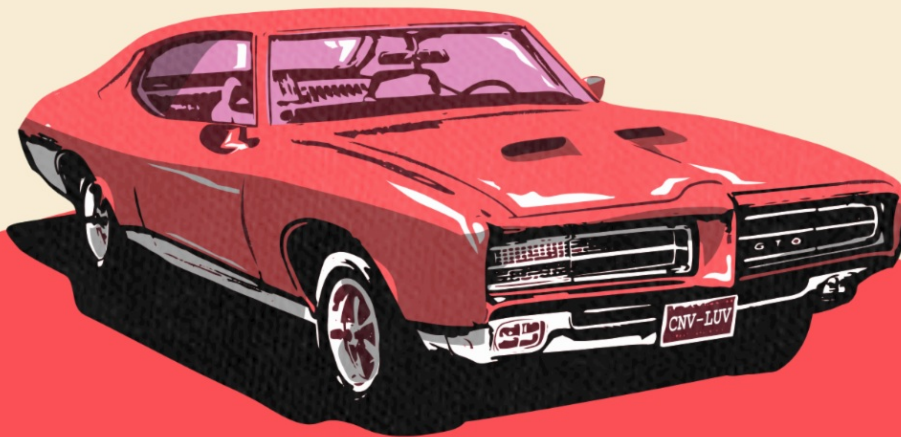
